The Fier Rents Act and putting rents up Op. (When else did enyone expect) a token resitance and then the inevitable climb down.

"We personally cant afford to follow the example of bra e little clay crossand even if we defied the government the tenants would have to pay in the end. Anyway its the law of the land."

Third side is war declared against the squatters by the Housing dept Their wastimed to coincide with the 50p increase and the tory councillors beginning their election campaign with propaganda about war heroes being on the waiting list for 30 years. Also barely concealed racial propaganda has been conceinstantly put out by the council offices both in the Housing and social services dept that Butsiders are the cause of the shortage of homes in Hackney.

Hackney housing is a misture of pre-war slum estates, large new council estres, and a vast amount of early 20th century houses - some being terted up others emptied and rotting on one side of the borough is up and coming raptidly bourgiosfied Islington, the other depopulated Tower Hamlets. (East End) . The previous Tory councilspolicy(i.e. Hakeney was Tory dring the period 67-70, the only time it had a Tory council for many yerss) was to declare Genral Improvement Areas - giving grants to landlords and property spectal tors to do up t eir houses: higher profits, higher rents. The present Labour Council's is to XEXIX declare Redevelopment areas - CPOs all round rehousing the owners and tenants (i f they've been there long enough, and bord ng up or knocking down streets at the same time. The numbers of homeless and badly housed rose. The Housing dept has decided to build no more tower blocks because 'they create social problems' and the councils cim is to lower the population density - rd to do this they push the old population out. This policy which is not just restricted to Hackney Confixed sawking the config. On the one hand capital needs workers usinly in Warry NANGER the capital intensive industries, which have moved out or are in the process of moving out of London (because land is cheaper) to cove out to work in thees industries where there isn't dways enough labour available, on the other hand it needs a number of workers particularily unskilled to service London. Because of a lack of cheap housing the shortage of service labour in London is increasing. Recently there have been recruiting drives in Glasgow and other far of places with offers of hostel accommodation to attract people to come and work for London transport traffic wardens etc. I combination of property speculation ad the Housing finance act has ment that local councils have less money less land and less prperty & - so housing conditions for the working class got worse all the time. (The fact that most of the councils Loney goes to paying back the interest Mada on loans from the city sharks the ns that their real budgets become less and less - as interest rates go up because of inflation - the crisis in international coptalism, investment moving away from the productive sectors into property etc.) This does not mean that the councils and here specifically Hackney council are not agents in the housing craisbut that they are less able to MAVERXXX patch up or mediate for capitlaism or disguise their own reactionary function. Hackney council has shown quite clearly that it is not prepared to Marecognise a state of class war, different groups of people are demontrating down at the town hall almost everyday about their housing conditions, all it trys to do is cover up for its own political lack of creibility "Its not our fault we're not building enough, the tories won't give us the money".
